The Purpose:

Atlanta Hospital Hospitality House believes that by providing lodging, meals and companionship we will improve the health and welfare of the families who have traveled to Atlanta for its world-class medical care.

The Power:

The families we serve are financially fragile, hungry and exhausted. Our services directly improve how a family navigates their medical crisis.

The Promise:

The AHHH promise to be good stewards of our support by providing a safe, quiet and caring environment that focuses on the individual needs of each guest.

The Facts:

- We have to raise \$250,000 per year to operate the Atlanta Hospital Hospitality House and the new Home Depot Marcus Hospitality Cottage.
- In 2008 we served over 4,000 accommodations and meals averaging 15 guests per night. We have served more than 100,000 guests since 1981 who have traveled from all over the U.S. and 39 different countries. In 2009 we will increase our capacity to 25 guests.
- We are the only facility of our kind in the Atlanta area that serves anyone with a need regardless of which medical facility refers them or what kind of medical issue they may have. Among the medical conditions facing our guests and their family members are cardiovascular problems, cancer, tuberculosis, transplants, autism and many others. The average length of stay is eight days; the range is one day to several months.
- We serve 17 regional medical facilities primarily Emory University Hospitals, the Veterans Administration Hospital, Kindred Hospital and are adding the Marcus Autism Center. Only 6% of our operating budget is donated by hospitals. The other 94% of our budget has to be raised by the AHHH.
- Every night at 7:00 p.m. we serve a home cooked meal to the guests of the AHHH. We pride ourselves in providing a "home away from home" in a comfortable and safe environment.
- The AHHH (the main house) occupies a beautiful Druid Hills mansion built in 1926 by Cator Woolford, founder of Equifax. The house was renovated by AHHH in 2004 and many original assets from the 1920's are now restored.
- The AHHH is building with Earthcraft designation, the Home Depot Marcus Hospitality Cottage in the footprint of the original dollhouse that Cator Woolford built for his daughters. The Cottage (expected opening in spring 2009) will house 10 additional guests, mainly from the Marcus Autism Center, and those who are handicapped.
